RIDEAU VALLEY, December 7, 2010 — Monarch Corporation, Canada's oldest real estate company, has made another major donation to the Rideau Valley Conservation Foundation's Environmental Land Fund. The money is used to help secure environmental land for future conservation use by the people of the Rideau watershed in Eastern Ontario.
