The RVCA's 2023 Annual Report showcases an extremely busy and productive year for all departments as they built bridges across the watershed. In the most literal sense, staff completed construction of two much-needed accessible pedestrian bridges at Baxter Conservation Area and Chapman Mills Conservation Areas, which will benefit the community for decades to come.

But staff also spent time connecting with valued partners, expanding their knowledge of the watershed and ensuring the RVCA's services remain relevant, valuable and accessible to everyone who calls the Rideau Valley home. on draft development policies & regulatory wetland mapping

The RVCA will host public consultations this June on updated development policies and regulatory wetland mapping to comply with Ontario Regulation 41/24, which came into effect April 1, 2024. Provincial changes now require the RVCA to regulate development activities in all wetlands plus a 30 metre buffer (reduced from 120 metres). Policy updates include changes to how watercourses, shorelines and natural hazards like floodplains and unstable slopes are regulated. Updated policies are online at regulations-planning and updated wetland mapping can be found at gis.rvca.ca/RegulatedWetlands.

Video series dives into risks of drinking surface water



Just in time for cottage season, the Mississippi-Rideau Source Protection Region (MRSPR) has released a series of short educational videos about keeping your drinking water safe when drawing directly from a lake or river. Drinking surface water comes with unique risks, including increased potential for harmful algal blooms, pathogens and chemical contaminants to impact drinking water safety. The new four-part video series covers the pros and cons of available water treatment options and even takes viewers on a tour of a home water treatment setup. New for 2025!

If you live in the City of Ottawa within the MVCA or RVCA watersheds, tree planting minimums have been lowered to 500 trees for 2025. This means Ottawa properties with 0.62 acres (0.25 hectares) of suitable land or more may be eligible for subsidies to replace lawns with trees, add windbreaks or create a privacy buffer. Book now!
